# Why do we need a different community model?

- The population is living longer
- As the age profile of the population increases, so does the number of people living with long-term conditions
- Demand is increasing (including referrals to community teams), but resources are not
- Primary care (GPs) is under increasing pressure
- Evident that the current community models will not be able to deliver the scale of transformational change required.....

## The Place-Based Model

- A local community model with GP practices at its core
- GPs working more closely together in “clusters”, each of which will support a population of approximately 30,000 people
- Encouraging other providers to work with these clusters including Gloucestershire Care Services, 2gether, Gloucestershire Hospitals Trust, South West Ambulances, Gloucestershire County Council, the voluntary care sector etc

## These clusters will....

- Review the types of services that people access locally
- Consider the range of people who use these services
- Evaluate how we can use resources within these clusters more effectively e.g. sharing specialist skills, pooling points of contact
- Establish whether there are better options to provide care in, or closer to, home for people who are admitted to hospital frequently



## Aims and objectives

- To deliver a real change in ensuring more accessible, sustainable and higher quality out-of-hospital care
- To enable a range of services from primary, community and mental health care to work together, removing organisational boundaries so that more patients are treated in the most appropriate manner and setting
- To wrap care around the patient with the support of social care to ensure that patients stay healthier, independent and at home for longer

## Aims and objectives (2)

- To identify those people in our communities who need more support than others
- To reduce duplication and address overlaps in service delivery
- To increase the focus on prevention
- To work differently to deliver the right care, in the right place, at the right time
